

Republican Party Organizational Structure

Republican National Committee
RNC

National Leadership that oversees the business of the GOP nationwide. They operate from their Washington, DC headquarters.

California Republican Party
CAGOP

State Leadership that oversees the business of the GOP, especially the 58 Counties (Congressional) in California, 40 Senate Districts, and 80 Assembly Districts. These Districts and their elected officials represent the people of the state of CA.

40 **Senate** Districts

54 Counties -
Congressional Districts

Each county has a County GOP Leadership Committee called the Central Committee. EX: **LAGOP (Los Angeles County GOP)** They oversee the activities of the Assembly Districts in their county.

80 **Assembly** Districts

Each Assembly District oversees the GOP activities for about 3-4 cities. The leadership of each Assembly District varies between 5-7 elected officials called Committee Members. They can also become State Delegates. Each delegate appoints an Alternate. These AD members are voting members for the County GOP. Each city in the AD have hundreds of precincts or neighborhoods. Each precinct could have as many as 500 voters.

PRECINCTS

A GOP Precinct Leader/Captain is a Volunteer who undertakes the leadership of their neighborhood. They typically are appointed by the Chair of their Assembly District and are non-voting Associate Members of the District. They are a source of information for their precinct on anything Republican. They organize Voter Registration Drives, GOTV, Voter Information / Education, Candidate Recruitments, Election Integrity, etc. They do this by bonding with their like-minded neighbors and creating relationships with them. The Precinct Leader is the GOP Go To person in the neighborhood.

ELECTIONS ARE WON AT THE PRECINCT LEVEL, MAKING PRECINCT LEADERSHIP A VERY IMPORTANT AND INFLUENTIAL POSITION FOR THE REPUBLICAN PARTY.
